

Everything Compliance - Episode 105 - GDPR, Competition Law, the Monaco Memo & FCPA Enforcement

A recent opinion by an Attorney-General at the ECJ involving Facebook suggests that competition law regulators can take GDPR into account when looking at enforcement?
